



## Henry Chadwick Remote Teaching Agreement for Parents

(Updated 22<sup>nd</sup> January 2021)

As you may be aware, it is now a legal obligation that we provide remote learning for children that are self-isolating or recovering from COVID-19 or if school must close due to a confirmed case, local lockdown or wider lockdown. Below are the expectations for this situation.

Please be aware that in our current lockdown (January 2021) that staff will also be working in school to deliver lessons to vulnerable children and the children of key workers.

Below are the expectations should **an entire class have to close**.

- Home learning will be delivered by Class Dojo. Where parents have not given permission for Class Dojo, the work will be available on the website.
- Daily lessons may contain a combination of video tutorials, PDF work sheets, set tasks and Power Point resources however there will be at least two video tutorials per day (these might be in the form of live lessons). School staff will deliver regular online lessons. These will be at least daily (Years 1 - 6). In EYFS, live sessions will be delivered at least twice per week. Please ensure that your child joins the online lessons at the appropriate time. Live sessions will be delivered by Zoom from a secure school email account.
- Please structure your child's day to include break, lunch and exercise times
- Children that have a designated work space set up during school hours and generally more successful at home learning
- At the beginning of each week a timetable will be sent to students. This will include daily maths, English and spelling / phonics sessions and wider curriculum subjects including PE. On this timetable will be the times of and links to live lessons.
- In addition, some children will receive small group intervention work, videos or Zoom sessions with their Teaching Assistant. This is to supplement the work sent by the class teacher and will be more individualised. The timetables for these sessions will be sent out at the beginning of each week and will contain the Zoom link.

- A weekly music lessons will be delivered by a link to 'The Oaks'
- PE will be through a Joe Wicks PE session. The link will be sent as part of the teachers' remote learning. He will also be delivering daily PE sessions at 9O'clock on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays - these are great for getting a daily routine started, keeping children fit and improving their mental well-being.
- Due to pressure on devices in homes. We will not deliver weekly assemblies as originally planned but a range of online lessons will mean that children can interact with their teacher and with one another. In additional your child's class teacher may deliver a Zoom assembly / informal catch-up weekly.
- If using Dojo, completed work should be uploaded to your child's Portfolio daily - this can be in the form of an uploaded piece of work, photograph, video or audio comment. This will be assessed daily by teaching staff who will 'like' the work and add a comment.
- If using email, please scan / photograph work and email it back to the home learning email daily. This will allow teachers to mark / assess and identify and areas of support needed.
- Staff can be contacted during normal school hours 8.30 - 4. Please do not expect staff to reply to comments or look at work out of these hours. If staff become unwell, learning will continue - provided by another member of staff. At this point, live lessons may cease until the staff member is well again.
- TAs may be involved in supporting individual children / groups as they would in the classroom. This could be a catch-up maths session, phonics session or a guided write.

**In the event that a single child / few children are isolating** they will receive daily work. This will not be as above due to the teacher teaching the remainder of the class. The expectations for this are:

- Four lessons will be sent home each day via Email / Class Dojo. These will contain a combination of video tutorials, Power Points, PDF documents, worksheets and tasks. These should be completed by the child, added to their portfolio (Dojo) or scanned and sent back to the home learning email daily. These will then be marked by the class teacher or whoever is monitoring the site for the class.
- Weekly timetables will be shared where considered appropriate.
- Children may be invited to join 'live; teaching sessions with their peers.
