
## Summer




## Reading Books—Reception

As you will now be aware we have bought some new reading books, that follow our Read, Write Inc phonics teaching scheme. The book is closely matched to the phonics band that your child is learning. They should therefore be able to identify the sounds in the book and blend the green words successfully.



This half term our we are developing our love of Albie books and reading a different one each week. All of our learning will be linked to the book each week. This week it is 'Supermarket Zoo'.



Your child will also be able to choose a 'Read for Pleasure' book that they will bring home for you to read to them. Their online account will still be active so you will still be able to access these as well.

Please ensure that your child has their book and planner in school everyday. Every time that you read at home, please write a comment in their planner so that they can gain raffle tickets and be in with the chance of winning a prize.

## Nursery
